REPORTS FROM MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS

Councilman Glaser reported that the Planning Board meeting for October was canceled and commented on items for the next Planning Board meeting. There is a Clinton Township Sewage Authority meeting scheduled in November. There was no report on the Finance Committee or Cannabis Committee at this time.

Councilman Kochanowski did not have a report for Finance Committee but mentioned that the Township Budget has started being discussed. North Hunterdon High School lost the Milk Can Game this past weekend.

Council President Strauss noted there was no report for the Board of Education. The Historic Commission will hold a meeting on November 1st. Council President Strauss commented on the reports from Public Safety and asked if Chief DeRosa could comment on the increase of pursuits within the Township. Chief DeRosa gave updates on the pursuits. Township Administrator, William Close, commented on the accreditation program for the Police Department and what the program entails. Council President Strauss finished his report with a reminder about the SAFE Night Out with the Police Department and Fire Department on October 31st at the old Municipal Building in Annandale.

Mayor Mullay gave an update from the Recreation Committee regarding Halloween Trunk or Treat, and the Food Truck Festival at Bundt Park. The Pickleball Tournament was a successful event. There will be personnel resolutions on the upcoming Mayor and Council meeting agendas. Leaf collections are going on in the Township and the residents can look on the website for updates regarding the collection periods.

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works is need of a Single Axle Dump Truck; and

WHEREAS, Capital Ordinance 1186-2023 was approved for various vehicles equipment which included \$200,000 for DPW vehicles and equipment; and

WHEREAS, Current budget Capital Improvement was approved for \$220,000 for various vehicles and equipment; and

WHEREAS, Gabrielli was awarded Sourcewell contract 060920-KTC for the forementioned vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Director has identified a price of \$224,583.78 for the vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that sufficient funds are available in the amount NTE \$ 224,583.78; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Township of Clinton, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, hereby authorize the Public Works Director to accept and purchase the forementioned equipment in the amount of \$224,583.78.

2. Resolution 194-2023 – Resolution of the Mayor and Council of the Township of Clinton establishing joint participation in the “Arrive Together” Program to enhance and support response to certain behavioral health crisis calls.

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CLINTON AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE “ARRIVE TOGETHER” PROGRAM TO ENHANCE AND SUPPORT RESPONSES TO CERTAIN BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS CALLS

WHEREAS, throughout the nation many communities have been exploring ways to bring mental health resources to citizens in the community and reduce the involvement of police in calls which are more mental health related than law enforcement related; and

WHEREAS, among those methods is an initiative known as the “ARRIVE Together” program (“Program”), under which mental health screeners respond to mental health calls as they are received by law enforcement instead of the current practice of waiting for law enforcement to respond, assess, then request mobile outreach services, which often results in officers dealing with an emotionally disturbed person (“EDP”) for an extended length of time while they wait for mobile outreach, if they are available to respond; and

WHEREAS, the Hunterdon County Prosecutor’s Office (“HCPO”) has indicated to the various law enforcement agencies operating in Hunterdon County that it is of the opinion that the Program will bring much needed mental health resources and follow-up services to the field, which should decrease the amount of time spent by law enforcement officers on mental health related calls, decrease the potential for use of

force situations, and ultimately reduce the number of mental health related calls to which law enforcement officers are required to respond; and

WHEREAS Hunterdon Healthcare (the “Mental Health Service Provider” or “MHSP”) has been designated by the New Jersey Department of Human Services (“DHS”) to provide screening and other medical/health services in accordance with State law and regulations, within Hunterdon County; and

WHEREAS DHS contracts annually with the MHSP for the provision of screening services and other services, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 10:31:10.1(c), and DHS Contracting Policy; and

WHEREAS, the HCPO, Hunterdon County Sheriff’s Office, Town of Clinton Police Department, Clinton Township Police Department, Delaware Township Police Department, Flemington Borough Police Department, Franklin Township Police Department, Frenchtown Borough Police Department, High Bridge Borough Police Department, Holland Township Police Department, Lambertville City Police Department, Lebanon Township Police Department, Raritan Township Police Department, Readington Township Police Department, Tewksbury Township Police Department, Washington Township (Morris) Police Department (Covering Califon Borough), West Amwell Township Police Department, and the NJSP (the “Participating Police Departments”) seek to establish joint participation with the MHSP in the “ARRIVE Together” program, in order to enhance and support responses to certain behavioral health crisis calls; and

WHEREAS the details regarding the Program are set forth in a memorandum of understanding (“MOU”) that memorializes the relationship among the Participating Police Departments and MHSP (collectively, the “Parties”) and delineates the responsibilities of the Parties in this cooperative joint effort (see Exhibit A attached hereto); and

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council find that participation in the Program will advance the health, safety and welfare of the public;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Township of Clinton in Hunterdon County, New Jersey, as follows:

1. The findings set forth in the preamble to this resolution is hereby incorporated as if more fully restated herein.
2. The Clinton Township Police Department (“CTPD”) is hereby authorized to participate in the joint “ARRIVE Together” program in order to enhance and support responses to certain behavioral health crisis calls, as set forth in more detail in the Memorandum of Understanding attached hereto.
3. Chief Thomas DeRosa is hereby authorized to sign the Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) attached hereto as Exhibit A on behalf of the Township and the CTPD, or such other substantially similar MOU as shall have been reviewed and approved by the Township Attorney.
4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Councilman Kochanowski motioned to approve Resolution 194-2023; Council President Strauss seconded the motion.

Resolution of the Mayor and Council of the Township of Clinton Supporting the Use of State and Federal Funds to Support the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Task Force to Replace Aging Emergency Response Vehicles and Equipment and for an Annual State Appropriation to Sustain Their Operations to Assure the Long-term Viability of this Critical State Asset

WHEREAS, The New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force is a non-profit corporation of the State of New Jersey that plays a vital role in responding to emergencies, disasters, and public health crises, providing critical medical services and support for communities through their partnerships with the New Jersey Department of Health, the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management, and other State Agencies as requested; and,

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force responds to major emergencies and crises throughout the year and is responsible for the development of all Statewide Pre-hospital emergency preparedness plans; and,

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force provides equipment to host agencies in every county in New Jersey and draws manpower from agencies all over the state; and,

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of an emergency response fleet and related equipment values in excess of \$60,000,000.00 that serves as the State’s operational level response for all medical emergencies and crises, and for major planned events; and,

WHEREAS, more than one-third of this emergency response equipment is at or beyond its’ useful life and must be replaced; and,

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan funds provide a unique opportunity to address the urgent need for equipment replacement, assuring the maintenance of a high level of readiness to the benefit of all state residents and visitors; and,

WHEREAS, it is essential to establish an annual allotment in the state budget to sustain New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force operations, ensuring that they have the resources needed to respond to emergencies efficiently; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township of Clinton in the County of Hunterdon expresses its full support for the provision of funding by the State of New Jersey to the New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force for both the use of American Rescue Plan funds for the replacement of aging EMS emergency preparedness equipment and vehicles and for an allotment in the state budget for the sustainment of the New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force.

BE IT FURTHER RESOVLED, that this resolution be shared with our state legislators, our Governor, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities and that we call upon our legislators and the governor to prioritize and advocate for necessary funding to

ensure the continued success and effectiveness of the New Jersey Emergency Medical Services Task Force.
